People continue to heed the call and answer with gifts of time, talent and treasure, helping us to realize the goal of ending systemic poverty in Immokalee, Florida. Highlights in the process of planning and construction during the year include completion of the plans and specifications for the site development and infrastructure (SDP) by Boral Engineering and Design, approval and issuance of the SDP permit application, awarding of the SDP contract to Heatherwood Construction, startup of the site development /infrastructure work, and completion of the plans and specifications for the multifamily buildings by LAI Design Associates.

But most importantly, we have broken ground! The dream of affordable housing will soon become a reality for these deserving residents as the first buildings are scheduled to begin construction this year. I am humbled, yet steadfast as we see this project through and truly make a difference in this vibrant community.

Board actions and timeline

For the 12 months ending December 31, 2021

- Approved a 2021 Budget
- Worked with architects, contractors, and other vendors to obtain site development permitting from Collier County authorities.
- Contracted with Soukup Strategic Solutions to work with the Capital Formation Committee to pursue capital formation efforts
- Selected Heatherwood Construction as general contractor for the project
- Developed a "Case Statement" brochure for use with potential donors
- Held Board meetings via Zoom through the entirety of 2021
- Held a "Ground Breaking Ceremony" with positive media coverage
- Kicked off a Capital Campaign at the Ground Breaking Ceremony
- Actively pursued and obtained grants and other donations to advance the project
- Continued efforts at promoting IFHA to individuals, community groups, and houses of worship in order to build relationships and share our story with others
- Opened a line of credit with First Florida Integrity Bank
- Instituted a "Moves Management" team in order to cultivate relationships with potential donors
- Contracted a Social Media Manager to increase our social media exposure
- Published several articles and produced two versions of a video promoting the coordinated work of IFHA
- Approved an IFHA Capitalization, Procurement, Records Retention, and Accounting Operating policies
- Met all Federal, State and County reporting requirements
- Received audit and IRS form 990 by CPA firm with no exceptions
- Purchased and implemented the use of "Basecamp" software to assist in management of work product by the Board



Funding the project

Our plan is to fund the project through charitable contributions from foundations, individual donors, and houses of worship. In the process of our fundraising efforts, we learned that many foundations have suspended their stated grant direction in 2020 and 2021 in order to address COVID 19 issues, including immediate needs of food and housing.


Our accomplishments during the year were as follows:

- Initiated a "Moves Management Committee," meeting weekly with our fundraising consultant at Soukup Strategic Solutions to develop strategies
- Held individual meetings with several foundations and individual prospective donors
- Gave in-person presentations to area churches and their mission committees
- Escorted potential donors and Centers of Influence on tours of Immokalee
- Organized the groundbreaking ceremony at the Lake Trafford site
- Maintained close relationship with the Collier County Community Foundation
- Met with other Immokalee-based non-profits and obtained their support and endorsements
- Maintained communication with donors through "thank you notes" and other informal written communication
- Initiated a system of donor referrals
- Provided input to the website and social media, resulting in unsolicited donations
- Sent a year-end status letter to all donors thanking them for their support and identifying our project's future financial needs
- Started donor outreach to people of influence and means
- Received a \$50,000 pledge payable across two years
- Raised \$482,400 from donors and grants and \$204,000 from churches and denominations during 2021.

Looking ahead to 2022

Plans for 2022 include recruiting three new members for the Fund Development Committee and working with law firms and financial institutions to develop planned giving.

- We have presented to the Collier County League of Women Voters and other civic organizations
- We presented to 1st Presbyterian Naples and received \$100,000 commitment for 2022.

Capital Campaign Action Plan

Individual Donors:

- Have already received a Firm pledge of \$1,000,000 to be paid in July, 2022.
- Have identified and met with another very strong candidate for a seven-digit contribution.
- Continue to identify individuals that we know or have been told share our concerns about low-income housing in Immokalee and have the resources to make a significant contribution. Those names have been assigned to individuals that already have a relationship or who know someone that can make an introduction. We are then putting together a plan to move those individuals from prospects to actual donors.





Grants

Community Foundation of Collier County has informed we have a \$200,000 donor directed grant that will be paid in February, 2022.

We are working with Soukup Strategic Solutions to expand our Grant application process which includes an application through Collier County for a \$500,000 SHIP grant.

Denomination/ Church Contributions

The IFHA is continuing to make presentations to church Mission Committees and congregations with the goal of being in their mission budget for at least the next five years. We also anticipate finding individuals in those congregations that have the heart and ability to contribute and to assist us in identifying contacts with foundations or businesses whose objectives mirror our own.

Both denominations and churches are continuing to be repeat contributors, and the number of denominations, individual church participation and congregation members participating continues to grow.









Our mission and vision

To eliminate substandard and overcrowded rental housing for farmworker families and other low-income residents of Immokalee.

The vision of the Immokalee Fair Housing Alliance is that farmworker families and other low-income residents of Immokalee have access to secure, affordable, hurricane-resistant rental housing that strengthens the community by fostering health, education, dignity and fi nancial stability.
